Hi Norfolk Island Community – let's talk bike safety! Wearing a bike helmet can reduce head injuries by up to 60%, serious head injuries by 53%, and fatal head injuries significantly. It's crucial for kids to wear helmets, and it's the law under Section 38(3) of the Traffic Act 2010 (NI).

Measles

Measles is a viral illness, it is an airborne disease which can spread when an infected person breathes, coughs, sneezes or talks. Measles usually starts with flu-like symptoms which may include fever, fatigue, severe cough, conjunctivitis, runny nose, white spots in the mouth (Koplik spots). There has been a recent increase in confirmed cases across Australia, most commonly in unvaccinated and under-vaccinated adults aged 20 to 49 years. It is important to remember that measles is a vaccine-preventable disease. The combination measles vaccine is recommended for:

Children aged 12 and 18 months, adolescents and adults born since 1966 who have not received two doses of a measles-containing vaccine and infants aged 6 months to less than 12 months who may be travelling overseas or to high-risk areas.

Vaccination is important for adults with higher risk of exposure, particularly people travelling, or returning from overseas, healthcare workers, childhood educators and carers, people who work in long-term care and correctional facilities.

If you or your child develop any of these symptoms, please seek medical advice. If you would like to get a vaccination, a booster vaccination please call the GP Clinic on 22091.

Japanese Encephalitis

Japanese encephalitis is a rare but serious illness caused by the Japanese encephalitis virus, which is spread to humans by infected mosquitoes. Most people who get Japanese encephalitis do not have any symptoms. If you get symptoms, they can appear 5 to 15 days after getting bitten by infected mosquitoes. Some people may get symptoms such as fever, headache, vomiting. People with a severe infection (1 in every 250 people) may get symptoms such as neck stiffness, disorientation, tremors, coma, seizures, paralysis. The virus has been detected in areas like Brisbane, North Burnett, and Central Queensland. If travelling to these areas, reduce mosquito bite risks by using insect repellent, wearing long sleeves, and removing standing water. NIHRACS offers the vaccine for free to eligible individuals, especially for those living or working in at-risk areas. The vaccine requires two doses 28 days apart, with immunity developing one week after the second dose.
