NI Active & Creative Kids is a program designed to encourage and support school-aged children living on Norfolk Island to be physically active and creatively engaged. All school-aged children from Prep to Year 12 who live on Norfolk Island are eligible to apply for two \$50 vouchers. These vouchers can be used for the child's choice of activities offered by registered local providers on Norfolk Island.

What's going on at NIHRACS

With the school year approaching, NIHRACS encourages families to book child and adolescent health check-ups ahead of term starting. This may include immunisation reviews, general health assessments, or follow-up of any concerns identified last year. Booking early helps ensure children are well prepared for the return to routine and reduces pressure on services once school resumes. Parents and carers are encouraged to contact the GP Clinic reception to arrange appointments. NIHRACS continues to support children and young people across all stages of development, working closely with families to promote healthy starts to the school year.

TEAM SPOTLIGHT - Child Health Nurse

The Child Health Nurse plays a vital role in supporting the health and development of children and young people aged 0–18 years. This service includes growth and developmental checks, immunisation advice, feeding and sleep support, and guidance for parents and carers. The Child Health Nurse also works closely with GPs to identify concerns early and support appropriate referrals when needed. As children prepare to return to school, this service helps ensure they are physically and developmentally ready for learning. Families are encouraged to access the Child Health Nurse for advice or routine reviews by contacting NIHRACS reception.

AWARENESS - Back-to-School Health

A healthy start to the school year supports learning, behaviour, and wellbeing. NIHRACS encourages families to focus on regular sleep routines, balanced meals, hydration, and limiting screen time before school resumes. Ensuring immunisations are up to date and addressing any hearing, vision, or general health concerns early can make a significant difference. If your child has a chronic condition or ongoing health needs, now is a good time to review management plans with your GP. Early preparation helps children feel confident and ready for the year ahead.

METRO NORTH

Concerned about your child's health, development, learning, or behaviour? Speak with your Child Health Service and GP for a referral to the Metro North Paediatric Service at The Prince Charles Hospital. We provide free, bulk-billed care for children aged 0–16 years, delivered in person at The Prince Charles Hospital or via telehealth. Our team includes Paediatricians, Speech Pathologists, Psychologists, and Occupational Therapists. Telehealth connects you to care from home or NIHRACS.

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT

Norfolk Island Central School & Banyan Park

NIHRACS values its ongoing collaboration with Norfolk Island Central School and Banyan Park to support children's health and wellbeing. Strong communication between health and education providers helps ensure children receive appropriate care and support during the school year.
