About the role

Opportunities are available to work in the Residential Aged Care Service or Emergency Department and Inpatient Unit, or both. Registered nurses at NIHRACS:

- Are responsible for planning and implementation of holistic, high quality, evidence-based nursing care, and when necessary, function as the team leader across emergency, general inpatient and residential aged care environments.
- Work as a team to support the delivery of excellence in care, liaising with multidisciplinary team members to improve patient outcomes.
- Ensures practice is in line with AHPRA Scope of Clinical Practice including ongoing professional development.
- Advocates for patient rights and access to quality care.
- Participates in audits and research to improve healthcare services. Advocate for best practice through the NSQHS standards. Assist the leadership team in the development of policies and procedures.
- Demonstrates knowledge and understanding of risk management, safety and quality, and continuous improvement principles and the role of the Registered Nurse in applying these.
- Recognises and respects the cultural diversity of the community, adapting healthcare practices to meet the specific needs and preferences of patients.
- Possesses basic computer literacy, knowledge of health information systems and Office 365 applications.

Selection Criteria:

Successful applicants will demonstrate:

- Current AHPRA registration as a Registered Nurse.
- Rural and Remote experience as a Registered Nurse, with aged care and / or, general and emergency nursing experience being highly desirable.
- Current ALS and ETEK Triage (or equivalent) qualifications, or willingness to obtain.
- Demonstrated ability to work in culturally diverse communities and adapt care approaches to the local population's values, customs, and healthcare beliefs.

- Ability to work effectively as a member of a collaborative team environment and to adapt to changing needs and conditions in a remote setting.

Remuneration: RN will be paid as NRG Grade 5 under the NIHRACS Enterprise Agreement. An indicative range of remuneration is \$3,171.89 to \$4,068.50 Per fortnight.
